After two impactful virtual conferences, home affordability advocates from across the country went back to Washington, D.C., for our annual legislative conference, Habitat on the Hill!

At Habitat on the Hill 2023: Advocacy for Impact, participants learned about the implications of a changing political environment on housing policy and discussed challenges and solutions for advancing Black homeownership with national and local housing experts. Additionally, they



met with congressional offices, celebrated a year of policy successes at all levels of government, and left with the tools necessary to increase their advocacy impact locally – all while connecting with peers in our nation's capital.

Habitat's Aging in Place program helps older adults, veterans, and people with disabilities age at home and in communities of their choice. We use a holistic approach to evaluate individuals needs and provide critical home repairs and modifications specific to each homeowner's lifestyle to help preserve their home and their independence.

For example, repairing flooring, replacing single pane windows, installing lever door handles, ramps, rails and raised toilets could make a home more accessible while providing independence and safety.

Our impact-safe and accessible housing is a key social determinant of health. As leaders in housing, with our vast network across the United States and evidence-based approach, Habitat's Aging in Place program advances both housing and health equity for older Americans.
