The Cost of Housing in Sonoma



Turn Your Car into a Home

Did you know your old car, truck, or motorcycle can help build homes in Sonoma County? Through our Cars for

County

Sonoma County continues to face a housing crunch: over 14,000 low-income renters don't have access to an affordable home, and many families are spending more than half their income just to keep a roof overhead. Renters need to earn \$40.48 per hour - 2.3 times the City of Santa Rosa minimum wage - to afford the average month rent of \$2,105. Rents in Sonoma County have increased by 15.2% between Q4 2019 and Q4 2024. This cycle leaves residents unable to save in order to make the jump from renter to homeowner. While State and federal funding for housing production and preservation has grown, none of it supports affordable homeownership, leaving hardworking residents stuck in the rental cycle. From nurses to mechanics, teachers to baristas, the people who keep our community running are being priced out.

Thrive Together

Homes program, donated vehicles are transformed into funding for affordable housing. In FY24-25 alone, this program generated \$137,327 in revenue, directly supporting families in need of safe, decent homes.

Volunteer Spotlight: NorBAR Builds and Gives Back

From September 9–11, the North Bay Association of Realtors (NorBAR) brought energy, enthusiasm, and teamwork to both our Blankenship Place build site and ReStore.

At the Sebastopol site, volunteers mixed concrete, dug footings, leveled ground, staked posts, and built a fence along the south property line, laying the groundwork for four future townhomes. At the ReStore, they merchandised the sales floor, and flipped furniture by sanding, painting, and refinishing items, allowing us to sell them for three times the original price. Every dollar raised directly supports our Habitat mission.

NorBAR volunteer Mike Lagoyda said it best:

"[Volunteering is] part of our mission as a company – we do real estate to strengthen our



community, not just sell houses. It's one of our core pillars."

"[Volunteering] makes me feel good. That you're in a spot to give back. It's a powerful thing."
